LSYPE Questionnaire content Waves 1 to 7

Introduction

The Longitudinal Study of Young People in England (LSYPE) follows the lives of nearly 16,000 people born in 1989-90. The study began in 2004, when the cohort members were aged 13-14, and has collected information about their education and employment, economic circumstances, family life, physical and emotional health and wellbeing, social participation and attitudes.

The initial LSYPE survey was in 2004 and included all young people in Year 9 who attended state and independent schools in England. Following the initial survey at age 13-14, the cohort members were visited every year until 2010, when they were age 19-20. In the first four waves of the study, data was collected from the main parent – both about themselves and their child - as well as the cohort member. Waves 5, 6 and 7 contain information from the young person only.

This document summarises the content of the LSYPE in waves 1 to 7. The detail of the Young Person Questionnaire has been grouped by the proposed themes for the age 25 survey:

- 1. Employment & Resources
- 2. Household Formation & Relationships
- 3. Education
- 4. Health & Wellbeing
- 5. Identity & Participation
