A scale of questions designed to identify problematic drinking behaviour

#### Malaise:

A series of questions designed to detect levels of emotional disturbance, well-being and stress

#### **Marital / relationship satisfaction:**

Happiness of relationship

#### Domestic division of labour:

How cooking, shopping, cleaning, laundry and ironing, household repairs / DIY, financial management and childcare is shared between cohort member and partner (if applicable)

#### Commitment to work:

Kanugo's scale of job involvement (4 items from a 10 item scale)

### Attitudes towards pensions / retirement

Questions from DWP's Attitudes towards pensions study 6 item agree / disagree scale

# Retrospective questions about childhood: Questions asked about the time cohort member was aged

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Number of people in household Number of rooms in household

# Efficacy / life satisfaction:

Whether cohort member feels that they usually get what they want out of life

Whether cohort member feels that they usually have a free choice or control over their life

Whether cohort member feels that they can usually run their lives as they wish

Satisfaction with way life has turned out so far Expected level of satisfaction in ten years time

#### Paper Send Ahead Questionnaire

#### Leisure activities

Regularity of taking part in 12 leisure activities (from The British Household Panel Study)

## **Personality inventory**

50 questions from the International Personality Item Pool (IPIP)

#### Health (SF-36)

Whether cohort member's health limits 10 types of activity – e.g. lifting or carrying groceries, climbing several flights of stairs Whether cohort member's health has caused problems with work or other regular activities in last 4 weeks

Whether emotional problems have caused problems with work or other regular activities in last 4 weeks

Whether emotional problems have interfered with normal social activities with family and friends etc.

Amount of bodily pain experienced in last 4 weeks

How much pain has interfered with normal work in last 4 weeks How respondent has been feeling in last 4 weeks (e.g. full of life, nervous)

Four statements about general health for cohort member to record level of agreement / disagreement – e.g. I am as healthy as anybody I know

#### Sleep

4 questions from the Medical Outcomes Study

#### Values and attitudes

A series of 21 statements to measure a range of different attitudes - cohort member must record level of agreement / disagreement (used previously in cohort studies).

An 8 item battery where cohort member must rate how important things are to them – e.g. owning their own home, having a fulfilling job

4 questions from British Household Panel Study

# Neighbourhood

9 questions on neighbouring and psychological sense of community

# CASP-14

A battery of 14 questions designed to measure the quality of life of those aged 50 and over

# **Prospective question**

Open question asking cohort members to imagine they are now 60 years old and describe what they are doing in terms of family life, employment, health etc.
