USE OF THIS CODING FRAME

From time to time amendment pages will be issued for this coding frame. If a new page to replace this page appears it will be updated by the page number at the top of the page eg 1/0 becomes 1/1.

The Data Processing Department should be informed of any errors found in the Coding Frame so that they may be altered accordingly.

PAGE COLOURING

For easy reference the pages of the coding frame are coloured according to the questionnaire concerned as follows:-

White - General Notes and Test Booklet

Green - Medical

Blue - Parental

Pink - Educational

Yellow - Individual

Explanation of Coding Frame Notation.

The Coding Frame has a similar format to the NCDS II Coding Frame, although some changes have been made.

Each item of information obtained in NCDS III about a child is punched into a particular part of a column or columns on one of the cards X1-X9, X1/2 - X1/4, called a 'field'.

Each page of the Coding Frame is split into five main columns :- (i) Question Number (ii) Field Description (iii) Computer Item (iv) Computer Code (v) Explanation and Permitted Punches. A brief description of each section will follow:-

(i) Question Number.

The question number, taken from the Questionnaire itself, is inserted in this column.

(ii) Field Description.

This comprises a note of the columns which make up a field, followed by one of the terms - 'coded', 'multicoded', or numeric, describing the type of field.

If the column is 'coded' or 'multicoded', then the permissible punches are also added.

eg. col 20
coded
punches Y-9

If the column is 'numeric', the range of that item will appear under 'Computer Code'.

(iii) Computer Item.

Here, item numbers are shown, which will be used when producing tables.

Care should be taken when specifying particular codes for tabulation, that the request for these is made using the 'Computer Code' and not the 'punches' figures.

'NA' is a special computer code for 'No answer' - ie. where the column has been left blank.

'DNA' is a special computer code for 'Does not Apply'. This most frequently occurs in the Coding Frame where a numeric item has a special value which can be set to DNA. eg. speech test-card X1 Cols 63-64, has a range 0-65 and also a punch XX meaning unable to test - this is set to DNA.

(v) Explanation and Permitted Punches.

This column gives details of the questions and possible answers, taken from the questionnaires. For a coded item, the permitted punches will appear down the right hand side of the page. For a numeric item, the range will be given. 'b' indicates no answer to that particular question.

NCDS III (SLEP 3, 1973/1974)Child's Serial Number

This is a six-figure number punched in Columns 5-10 of each card, which identifies the data for each child.

The majority of these serial numbers were allocated to the children in the 1958 Perinatal Mortality Survey. Some were allocated in NCDS I (1965), NCDS II (1969), and more in NCDS III (1973) for children who were born abroad or born within Great Britain but with no data in either the Perinatal Mortality Survey, NCDS I or NCDS II. No two children have the same serial number.

The first three digits (cols 5-7) of the serial number indicate when and how the number was allocated; the last three digits (cols 8-10) are an individual number for the child.

Numbers allocated in 1958 for the Perinatal Mortality Survey

<u>Cols 5-7</u>	<u>Meaning</u>
000-999, X00-X99	This is the Code Number for the Local Authority of the area in which the child was born, based on a 1953 list. Column 5 is the region code which is interpretable like Column 2.
<u>Cols 8-10</u>	Numbers from 001 up were allocated to the births (or stillbirths) within a Local Authority. Not all are used and there are gaps.

These numbers appear on forms J, K, and R (JKR's for short) of the P.M.S. records. (With the exception of numbers for multiple births in the P.M.S., which may have been changed but are still of this type).

Numbers allocated in 1965 for N.C.D.S.I

<u>Cols 5-7</u>	<u>Meaning</u>
Y00	Child born abroad but living in England, Scotland or Wales at the time of N.C.D.S. I (1965)
Y01	Child born in England, Scotland or Wales, but with no data in the Perinatal Mortality Survey (though it may have a P.M.S. number on the JKR's).
Y10-Y19, Y1X *	Unmatched with P.M.S. data. Column 7 has the region code from the child's 1965 Local Authority, based on a 1965 list, and interpretable like Column 2.

The complete serial number is treated as a numeric item on the computer. In order to do this, the 'X' punch has been given a value of 10 and the 'Y' punch a value of 20.
