ONLINE DIET QUESTIONNAIRE	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Oxford WebQ – a 24 hour recall of food and drink consumption on two days. Days randomly selected from the seven days following the nurse visit. Nutrient intake automatically derived. 	
NURSE VISIT – BIO-MEASURES	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Medications – collecting all prescribed medications • Seated and standing blood pressure • Grip strength • Blood sampling • Anthropometry – weight, body fat, waist and hip • Timed walk • Leg raise – balance
